- Must be between ages 16-24 years old
Referrals will be made for youth 16-17 who do not qualify for the program
- Must be a New York City Resident
- Have a High School Diploma or GED
- Not attending school or working
- Be legally authorized to work in the U.S
- Meet an Income or Barrier eligibility criteria
- Commit to a 9AM to 5PM, Mon-Fri schedule

The Door's Train and Earn Programs is a career pathways program that provides comprehensive job training and employment services, along with support services needed by participants to find a permanent job, and access post-secondary education and training

Eligibility Requirements

- Be between ages 18-24 years old
- Be a resident of New York City
- Have High School Diploma or GED
- Not working or in school
- Be authorize to work in the U.S
- Selective Service Registered, If born Male and 18+
- Available Monday - Friday, 9am-5pm schedule
- Must meet at least one of the following:
 - Homeless Or runaway,
 - in foster care (current or aged out)
 - Pregnant or parenting
 - Justice-involved
 - Has a disability
 - Lives in a high-poverty census tract
 - Meets income eligibility (receives public assistance or falls within poverty guidelines)

Enrollment Process

1. **Sign Up** – Complete the Interest Form & Become a Door Member.
2. **Pre-Screening** – We'll call to check your eligibility.
3. **Submit Documents** – Gather and provide the required paperwork.
4. **Intake Session** – Attend a one-day intake to complete Door paperwork and take the TABE Math/Reading assessment (9th-grade level required).
5. **Interview** – Meet with a program staff to assess program alignment and readiness
6. **Program Application** – Fill out the DYCD application and attend a mandatory info session.
7. **Get Started** – Once approved, you're ready to begin your career journey!
